RULES & POLICIES

2022

WARNING

Under Texas Law (Chapter 87, Civil Practices and Remedies Code), a farm animal professional or livestock show sponsor is not liable for any injury to or death of a participant in farm animal activities or livestock shows resulting from the inherent risks of farm animal activities and livestock shows. Definition of a "farm animal" includes an equine animal according to State law.

PROPERLY EXECUTED LIABILITY RELEASES FOR AAYHA REQUIRED

All exhibitors must sign a Hold Harmless Agreement/Release before entries will be accepted. AAYHA may incorporate this release into membership forms or entry forms. Minors under the age of 18 must have a Hold Harmless Agreement/Release signed by a parent or legal guardian.

2022 GENERAL SHOW RULES AND POLICIES

The 2021 AQHA Official Handbook will govern all AAYHA events, with the exception of any rule stated in the 2021 AAYHA Speed Series Rule Book.

The purpose of the AAYHA General Rules is to establish procedures for general show operations. The General Rules will also be used to provide a basic description of each AAYHA event.

MEMBERSHIP INPUT TO AAYHA GENERAL RULES

Any changes to the AAYHA General Rules must reflect member inputs and adhere to AAYHA By-Laws. As such, the Board of Directors will be responsible for managing the General Rules that govern the rules for AAYHA events, including but not limited to the Speed Series and Jackpot events. In execution of their responsibility, they will annually review the General Rules for applicability by surveying the Board and AAYHA membership. However, it is only the general membership, during the annual membership meeting that can make permanent changes to the General Rule changes, via a formal vote, for the upcoming season. AAYHA By-Laws allow Executive Committee decisions/rulings made for the purpose of ensuring the smooth, safe, and fair running of AAYHA shows to be reviewed by the AAYHA board to determine if the decision/ruling should be retained for the remainder of the show season. Temporary show rules approved by the Board can only be made permanent by the general membership of AAYHA as noted above. Note that these temporary show rules approved by the board will be incorporated and identified in the current show rules.

SUNDAY AAYHA MEMBERSHIP

AAYHA membership applications are available at www.aayha.org or in the show office. Membership dues are payable online or at any show. Requirements for membership must be met prior to participation in any AAYHA class on Sundays.

Membership Dues: Individual	\$ 25

Purpose of Membership:

1. Your membership allows you to compete in Sunday AAYHA classes. No person may compete in any AAYHA event on Sundays without a current paid membership
2. Only current AAYHA Members over the age of 18 can vote during the club's annual membership polling

Requirements for Membership:

1. Turn in a properly filled out membership application
2. Payment of membership dues (listed above)
3. Present a copy or email a SCAN (again, please no photos of a current negative coggins for any horse(s) the contestant will be bringing onto the show grounds.

5. Complete and turn in or SCAN and email a W-9 for any contestant (including youth)

SUNDAY FEES

Fees for participation in AAYHA events shall be as follows:

1. Membership Fees (as detailed above; payable once per year)
2. Office Fee: \$10.00 every show per contestant, EXCEPT stick horse only or leadline only
3. Grounds Fee: \$5.00 every show for every horse, EXCEPT those who have rented a stall for the horse. If you elect to rent a stall, the grounds fee is waived. Other EXCEPTIONS are leadline only.
4. The Schedule of AAYHA Class entry fees are:

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Leadline	\$50 (includes all classes; no office fee or grounds charge)
Pole Bending*	\$15
Stake Race*.....	\$15
Straightaway Barrels*	\$15
Cloverleaf Barrels.....	\$15
Mystery event.....	\$ 15

Entry fees must accompany entry forms, unless a participant elects to email entry forms in prior to the show. In that case, the participant must report to the show office prior to the start of his or her first class to pay fees. A contestant who sends forms in early will not be entered in his or her classes until all fees are paid in full. Once a participant has ridden in his/her first registered class of the day, no entry fees will be refunded.

5. In order to add or delete a class, participants must complete an Add/Delete slip at the show office. Applicable class fees will apply for adding classes and no refunds will be given for dropping classes. No participant may register for a class once the class has started.

SUNDAY DIVISIONS

1. AAYHA will use the following divisions on Sundays:
 - Assisted (ALL AGES)
 -
 - 8 & Under
 - 9-13
 - 14-18
 - 19+

Note: Participants entered into age divisions shall be determined by the age of the participant on January 1st of the year the show season starts.

2. No contestant may move up or down to another age group. The only exception to this rule is if the contestant enrolled in the leadline division participants and desires to move to the appropriate age division. This can be done when the contestant feels ready to compete in the rider's age appropriate division. However, once a contestant transfers out of the leadline division they may not return. Member understands that points earned in the leadline division will not transfer to another age division.

SUNDAY QUALIFICATION

REQUIREMENTS

1. The One-Horse-One-Rider Rule does NOT apply to any Sunday event, class, jackpot or series at AAYHA.
2. Properly Executed Release Forms. All exhibitors must sign a Hold Harmless Agreement/Release of Liability before entries will be accepted. Minors under the age of 18 must have a Hold Harmless Agreement/Release signed by a parent or legal guardian.
3. Work Point Requirements. Work points go towards qualifying for daily and awards.
 - a. Participants will be required to work 1 point per show in order to qualify for any daily and circuit-end awards/payouts. 1 Work Point equals 1 event worked, sign up will be in the show office.
 - b. Work points can be completed by the individual AAYHA member, or any other individual designated by that member. However, board members may not contribute work points to any AAYHA participant other than an immediate family member. Work points can be purchased for \$ 10.00 per how.
 - c. A contestant found to have not obtained a work point for a show may make up work points at future shows only with special permission of the AAYHA Board. Make up work points must be made up with 2 work points for each missed work point.
 - d. Signing up to work and not appearing to actually work will not result in a work point. Failing to sign up to work an event prior to the member completing his/her events for the day is not an excuse for not obtaining work points.
4. Coggins Requirements. Participants, exhibitors, and those not showing but with a horse on the show grounds MUST have with them a current (within 12 months of the event) NEGATIVE Equine Infectious Anemia (Coggins) test document, a VS10-11, for each horse brought on to the grounds. At every show, all participants entering the show grounds must provide the original copy, a photocopy or an electronic copy with the issuing Veterinarian's signature visible to the show management. Participants not providing a negative Coggins will be asked to leave the grounds. Those participants not showing or exhibiting in classes will be charged a \$10 grounds fee for the purpose of documenting the Coggins report.
5. Participants do have to be an AAYHA member to qualify for daily awards for Sunday events.

1. The following criteria for AAYHA awards 2021 are:

3. Participation in a class is defined as entering the arena during which the class is being judged or timed. Simply paying for a class does not constitute participation in a class. Furthermore, the following codes will be used to characterize a member's participation in a class

- DQ (Disqualification): Participant paid to show in a class and showed in the class during the time the paid class was held. However, participant was disqualified by the judge. For points purposes, member will earn no points but WILL be considered to have participated in the class.
- SC (Scratch): Participant paid to show in class but at a later time intentionally withdrew from the class prior to the time the paid class was held. For points purposes, member will earn no points and WILL NOT be considered to have participated in the class.
- NS (No Show): Participant paid to show in class but did not enter the arena during the time the paid class was held. For points purposes, member will earn no points and WILL NOT be considered to have participated in the class.

Section V – Points & Payout

SUNDAY POINTS

1. Points by Class Placing. Points will be figured as indicated below. In judged and speed events, individual show ribbons or trophies will be awarded to the top 10 participants. In speed events, all times will be recorded, with the exception of assisted and stick horse division.

- a. Points for the top twenty participants in each event will be awarded as follows regardless of the number of participants:

1 st 20 pts	6 th 15 pts	11 th 10 pts	16 th 5 pts
2 nd 19 pts	7 th 14 pts	12 th 9 pts	17 th 4 pts
3 rd 18 pts	8 th 13 pts	13 th 8 pts	18 th 3 pts

2. Disqualifications and No-times. A disqualification or no time constitutes no points for the participant in that event.
3. Ties. For Daily and Circuit-end awards/payouts, ties will be broken by the participant with the most number of 1st placing. If the number of 1st placing is the same, then the tie will be broken by the participant with the most number of 2nd placing, and so on until a winner is declared.
1. Individual equipment failure shall cause disqualification only if it causes the incompleteness of an event. No refunds will be awarded for the incompleteness of an event due to individual equipment failure. In the event that there is still tie after comparing all placing, the winner will be decided adding each contestant's times for the day. The participant with the lowest combined time will be declared the winner OR by the two tied contestants participating in an additional event as determined by the AAYHA Executive Committee.
2. Participants will be called to the gate three times only. If participant is not in the arena after the third call, he/she will receive no points, be considered a No Show (NS) and no refund for the class.

GENERAL RULES FOR ALL EVENTS

3. A contestant member may receive a no time in an event and/or receive up to a \$50.00 fine and/or be disqualified from the current show or future shows and/or association with NO REFUNDS for the following:
 - a) Unsportsmanlike conduct. Actions considered as unsportsmanlike conduct include, but are not limited to: mistreatment (including excessive schooling or beating) of an animal; throwing of equipment; use of foul or vulgar language; vulgar or hostile gestures and/or behavior; verbal or physical threats to another AAYHA member or show participant; repetitive intentional interruptions to show operations by the contestant or the contestant's parents or family.
 - b) If a contestant is not present and ready when called to compete. After contestant's name is called three (3) times, it will be assumed that contestant is not present and he/she will be disqualified from that event.
 - c) Cheating or attempting to cheat. The attempt to fix, threaten, bribe or harass the judges at any time between opening and closing dates of the rodeo, in or out of the arena.

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- d) Failure to comply with the AAYHA Dress Code.
- e) Entering pens of drawn stock without consent or presence of judges.
- f) Any electrical device attached to animal. (This does not include decorative lights or video cameras, etc.)
- g) Contestant and/or parents/guardians/representatives of contestant call the rodeo secretary/Board members to see how and if a contestant placed at a show. Points are to be posted before the next AAYHA Show, on AAYHA's Facebook page and/or the AAYHA website. Times will be posted during the event, for participants/parents to review. Contestant and/or parents/guardians/representatives of contestant are welcome to write the organization, 124 Rosewood Dr., La Vernia, TX 78121, regarding ANY discrepancies of points, show results, awarding of prizes, etc. accompanied with \$50. If complaint is found valid your money will be returned, however, if the board denies your claim, you will be notified in writing (please include correct mailing address), and your money forfeited. No videos will be reviewed from cell phones, cameras, etc. as evidence of a claim.

If any of the above occurs in the arena, no placing will be awarded for that event. The executive committee may, at their discretion, disqualify a participant from taking part in the remaining events for that day. Any subsequent points will be forfeited. If unsportsmanlike conduct should occur outside of a class, but on the property where the event is held, that person is subject to the ruling of the executive committee.

- 4. Exhibitions in Classes. Exhibitors paying a \$7.00 class "exhibition" entry fee will conform to the flow of the class and the judge's commands to class participants from the moment entering the arena to lining up in front of the judge. If at any point an exhibitor is determined to be a distraction to class participants or impeding the flow of the class being judged or timed, the judge has the authority to excuse exhibitor from the class.
- 5. No Appeals – The decision of the judge is final.
- 6. Member Protests – The executive committee will be responsible for the resolution of protests submitted by AAYHA members during AAYHA events. If a protest identifies an ambiguity or omission in the AAYHA General Rules related to show operations, the executive committee decision/ruling will clarify/interpret the ambiguity/omission. The executive committee's decision/ruling will be final for that show. The AAYHA Executive Committee will not entertain any protests regarding decisions made by a judge. Protests must be made in writing and mailed in with \$50.00 as specified above.
- 7. The fall of a horse or rider being judged shall, at the discretion of the judge, be cause for disqualification in all classes. Typically, a horse is considered having fallen when he or she is on their side and all four feet are extended in the same direction and a rider is considered to have fallen when he or she is not astride. However, final discretion resides with the judge
- 8. For the safety of all AAYHA participants, handlers of Assisted Division participants will be required to be present with Assisted participants in ALL classes.
- 9. Stalls MUST be paid for before horses are put into them. Participants found to have put horses in stalls without payment will be subject to the AAYHA stall fee, plus a \$50.00 fine.
- 10. Shavings MUST be purchased through the San Antonio Rose Palace. No outside shavings are allowed to be brought to the facility. Any person found using outside shavings will be charged an additional \$50.00 fine, plus the cost of their shavings.
- 11. Non-Sufficient Funds (NSF) – Any person who has written a check to AAYHA returned for NSF will be subject to an additional fine of \$45.00 made payable to AAYHA. If a participant writes one NSF checks in one year, the participant will only be allowed to pay with cash or credit card (if the credit card option is available at that time).
- 12. Entry into Show Secretary Office – Only current AAYHA Board Members are allowed to enter the Show Secretary's office during a show. Please be respectful and do not walk behind the desks of the show staff in the registration office for any reason unless invited.
- 13. Control of Horses and Pets – Horses and pets must remain under control of handlers at all times. AAYHA may request that any unruly animal be removed from the show grounds at any time. Fees will NOT be refunded.

Please treat others as you would like to be treated. All members, participants, and spectators are expected to be courteous, polite and respectful at all AAYHA events. This common courtesy should extend beyond the day of the event and shall also apply to the use of

social media during and after the show/events. All participants should be able to enjoy AAYHA events without fear of bullying, disrespect, or rudeness from other participants, members or spectators. AAYHA takes pride in providing a friendly, family-oriented atmosphere for participants, and has a clear expectation of good sportsmanship on the part of anyone associated with the organization. The AAYHA Board of Directors has the right to remove spectators, participants, and members from the club for unsportsmanlike conduct. In the event a person is removed for conduct, no membership fees will be reimbursed.

SUNDAY ATTIRE

Contestants must wear strictly western attire in the arena at all times. (Arena, chutes, roping boxes and pens)

- (a) Shirt with short or long sleeves, **tucked in**, and long pants (No shorts, cut-offs, spaghetti straps, tube-tops or t-shirts without a collar allowed)
- (b) Western boots or sport shoes with heels. No tennis shoes will be allowed
- (c) Headgear is optional; the use of helmets is encouraged
- (d) Each contestant will be allowed one attire warning per show which must be corrected before the contestant is allowed to continue for the day even if they have not started competing. Hats and caps, are optional.
- (e) Special attire exceptions because of religious or physical handicap must be requested by filing a written request to AAYHA and obtaining written approval prior to participation.
- (f) Exhibitors paying a \$.7 "exhibition" class entry fee must also dress according to the dress code.
- (g) In assisted events, the individual leading the assisted participant (handler) is required to follow AAYHA attire requirements with the exception that tennis shoes may be worn. In no instances will shorts, tank tops, or flip-flops will be allowed.
- (h) Judges may penalize contestants who do not conform to above attire requirements. However, judges, at their discretion, may authorize adjustments to attire due to weather-related conditions.
- (i) Lewd or suggestive attire, or attire displaying vulvar language may not be worn at any time on the premises of AAYHA events.

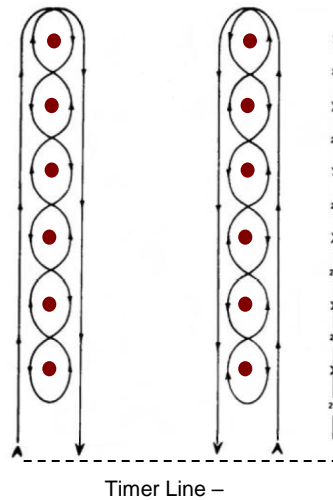
GENERAL SPEED RULES

1. In Speed events, the intentional throwing of equipment will result in a five (5) second penalty.
2. The judge, at his/her discretion, may disqualify a contestant for excessive use of a bat, crop, whip or rope in front of the cinch.
3. Shirts must be tucked in when show participants enter the arena. For a shirt to be considered "not tucked in", the shirt *tail* must be on the outside of the exhibitor's pants at the time of entry into the arena. A rider whose shirt becomes "un-tucked" during the course of the ride after entry into the arena will not incur a penalty.
4. In speed events, unless otherwise specified, time will begin when the horse's nose FIRST crosses the timer line and stops when the horse's nose crosses the timer line a SECOND time. If any part of the horse crosses the timer line BEFORE completing the course, rider will receive a no time for any speed event.
5. Failure to follow pattern will cause a disqualification and results in NO points for that contestant.

POLE BENDING

1. Event Description – AAYHA will reference AQHA rules beginning with SHW703 for the Pole Bending race.
2. AAYHA unique rules for the Pole Bending race will require participants to run a pattern around six (6) poles alternately going left and right around each pole as fast as possible according to the Pole Bending pattern in the following manner:
 - a. A horse may start either to the right or to the left of the first pole and then run the remainder of the pattern accordingly.
 - b. Timing begins when the horse's nose first crosses the timer line and ends as the horse's nose crosses the timer line again.

3. Penalties – Knocking over a pole shall carry a five-second penalty for each pole knocked over. Failure to follow the pattern will cause disqualification (DQ). Contestants may touch a pole with their hand. However, if the original course is altered by a rider intentionally grasping a pole, a five second penalty for each pole grasped will be assessed.



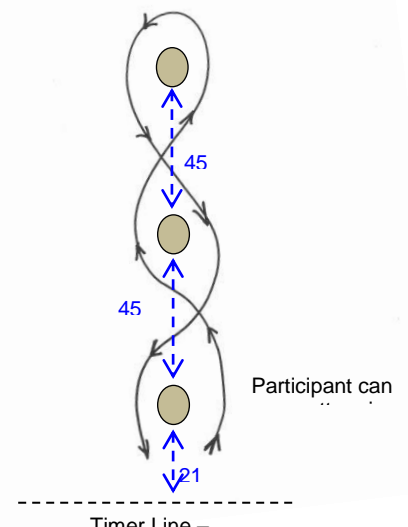
8.2 STAKE RACE

Event Description – AAYHA will use the following rules for the Stake Race.

1. AAYHA unique rules for the stake race will require participants will accomplish a figure-eight pattern around two poles fast as possible according to the Stake Race pattern in the following manner:
 - a. Run straight down the right or left side of the poles to the 2nd pole, making either a left or a right-handed turn around the pole
 - b. Run on a diagonal to the 1st pole and make a turn in the opposite direction
 - c. Run on a diagonal back to the 2nd pole and repeat the 1st turn
 - d. Run straight back down either the left or the right side of the poles (down the opposite side from where you started) and cross the finish (timer) line.
2. Penalties – **Knocking over a pole** or failure to follow the pattern **shall cause a disqualification.**

8.3 STRAIGHTAWAY BARRELS

1. Event Description – Straightaway Barrels is a unique AAYHA timed event where participants will run a pattern around three (3) barrels alternately going left and right around each barrel as fast as possible according to the Straightaway Barrels pattern in the following manner:

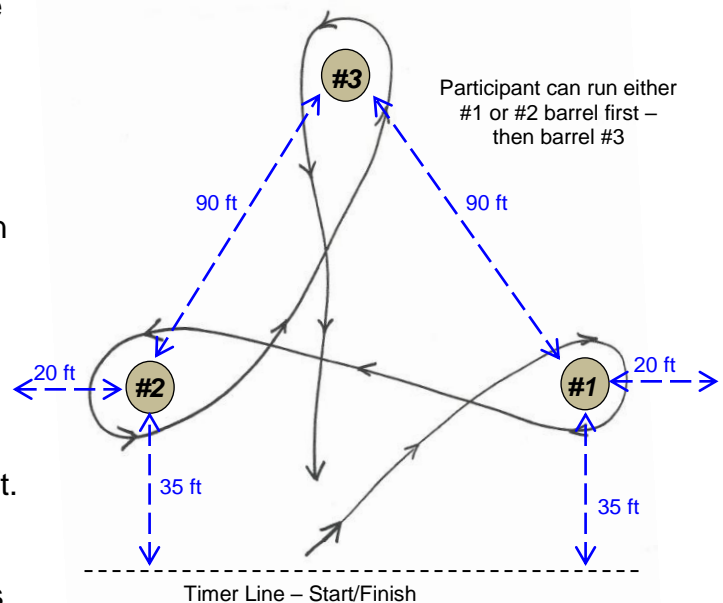


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- a. The participant may follow the straight away pattern in either direction, beginning from the right or from the left.
 - b. Timing begins when the horse's nose first crosses the timer line and ends as the horse's nose crosses the timer line again.
 - c. A participant may touch a barrel with their hand.
2. Penalties – Knocking over a barrel shall carry a five (5) second penalty for each barrel knocked over. Failure to follow the pattern shall cause disqualification.

8.4 CLOVERLEAF BARRELS

1. Event Description – AAYHA will reference AQHA rules beginning with SHW700 and NBHA Section A Competition Rules for the Cloverleaf Barrels race.
2. AAYHA unique rules for the Cloverleaf Barrels race will require participants to run a pattern around three (3) barrels as fast as possible according to the Cloverleaf Barrels pattern in the following manner:
 - a. The participant may follow the cloverleaf pattern in either direction, beginning from the right or from the left.
 - b. Timing begins when the horse's nose first crosses the timer line and ends as the horse's nose crosses the timer line again.
 - c. A participant may touch a barrel with their hand.
3. Penalties – Knocking over a barrel shall carry a five (5) second penalty for each barrel knocked over. Failure to follow the pattern shall cause disqualification.



INHUMANE TREATMENT OF LIVESTOCK 1. Deliberate inhumane treatment of livestock WILL NOT BE TOLERATED anywhere on the rodeo grounds. 2. A minimum fine of \$25 will be assessed for each offense, not to exceed \$100 per offense and/or disqualification from the current and/or following playdays and may receive a no time in that event. Contestant will be notified of the fine immediately, if possible. If the fine is issued, the AAYHA Executive Committee will give the amount of the fine and the reason for the fine. The AAYHA secretary will keep a log of all fines issued by contestant name and amount of fine.

Section IX – Show Personnel Responsibilities

9.1 JUDGES

1. Judges will be made aware of, and expected to follow and enforce AAYHA's General Rules.
2. Judges will promote good horsemanship and sportsmanship.
3. Judges will evaluate events in a fair and impartial manner.
4. Judges will be expected to act in a manner reflecting good sportsmanship at all times.
5. Judges shall place ten (20) places in all judged/timed events on Sunday.

9.2 ARENA COORDINATOR

1. The arena coordinator is responsible for setting up equipment for events in accordance with the by-laws of the Association.

9.3 ANNOUNCER

1. The announcer will call events and participants to the arena or event area.
2. The announcer will refrain from making personal remarks to participants while an event is being judged or while a participant is conducting a pattern.
3. The announcer will immediately notify arena personnel (judge(s), arena coordinator, etc.) of all observed hazards.
4. The announcer is responsible for keeping the show moving at a smooth and rapid, but safe, pace.
5. The announcer will make general announcements when asked to do so by show management.
6. The announcer will call participants into the arena by posted working order, unless circumstances dictate otherwise.

9.4 SECRETARY, POINT SECRETARY AND TREASURER

1. The point secretary shall compute high point awards for the individual shows and report show results to the Association points secretary within ten (10) days.
2. The secretary shall prepare posting sheets for the announcer and, if necessary, gatekeeper.
3. The Treasurer will collect fees, provide cash flow required for show and tabulate financial reports for all shows.

9.5 TIMERS

1. There shall always be two timekeepers; a primary electronic timer and backup electronic timer.
2. In the case where both the electronic timers fail, the contestant will be given the option to run again.

Table of AAYHA General Rule Clarifications and Membership Changes

Any clarifications to the AAYHA General Rules made during the current show season must be logged into the following table in order to track rule clarifications. Rule clarifications will be done via AAYHA Board of Director Corporate Resolutions. In no way will corporate resolutions conflict or diminish current AAYHA By-laws or General Rules, nor establish precedence over them. Corporate Resolutions will be used to clarify ambiguous portions of the General Rules. For any clarifications in the AAYHA General Rules to be permanent, they must be presented to the AAYHA membership during the Annual Membership meeting for a vote. The process for permanently amending AAYHA General Rules must comply with AAYHA By-laws. Please note that all Corporate Resolution driven General Rule clarifications will be in red throughout the General Rules. All changes made to these rules by the general membership will also be documented in the table below as well.
